CVTC Offers Virtual Sessions on Safety, Inclusion

Lunch & Learn series start March 16

Eau Claire, WI - Chippewa Valley Technical College is offering business leaders and employees the opportunity to update their worker safety skills and learn more about increasing equity, diversity and inclusion during two monthly Lunch-and-Learn series.

The Lunch & Learn Safety series covers topics of Emergency Action Planning on March 16, Worker Compensation on April 22, Fall Protection on May 18 and Ergonomics in the Workplace on June 16. Each online session hosted on Microsoft Teams will be held from noon-1 p.m. Cost is \$25 for all four sessions.

The event is designed for safety managers, human resource professionals, maintenance employees, front-line supervisors and any employee who is interested in updating their safety skills and knowledge. This safety series provides current information on the most relevant safety topics to revitalize approaches to safety management and will be taught by CVTC's experienced safety trainers.
